Fun Run/Walk

Tuesday, June 30 – 6:00 a.m. (Bus departs hotel lobby at 5:30 a.m.) The 14th annual NFHS Fun Run/Walk will be held at 6 a.m. Tuesday, June 30. The location of the 5K (3.1 miles) event will be at an offsite park 10 minutes from the Chicago Marriot Downtown Magnificent Mile. Transportation will be provided; the bus will depart the Marriott at 5:30 a.m. sharp. Plan to be in the hotel lobby by 5:15 a.m. Cost of the Fun Run/Walk is \$20, which includes a commemorative race T-shirt. The race will be timed, and water will be available at the starting line. Trophies will be awarded to the top two males and top two females in both walking and running divisions. Individuals who sign up for the Fun Run/Walk may obtain pledges for a specified amount per mile to raise additional money for the Foundation.

High school bowling is an up-and-coming sport. Currently, 22 states have schools that sponsor bowling as a varsity sport with 4,582 schools and 51,744 participants nationwide. Sixteen state associations sponsor a state bowling championship for girls, and 14 states offer a boys state bowling championship. High school bowling programs are gaining popularity across the country because they offer opportunities for students who don't compete in other sports; there are no size, strength or gender limitations; the start-up costs are minimal; and they provide an additional opportunity to compete and earn high school varsity letters and college scholarships.

The United States Bowling Congress is sponsoring the sixth NFHS Foundation Bowling Tournament. Come and learn about the benefits of high school bowling while having lots of fun. Players will compete in teams of four with a new game format designed to increase the level of fun. Entries are \$25 per person or \$100 per team, which covers all bowling expenses. Form several teams from your state association to spark a friendly rivalry. Many prizes will be awarded, including prizes to the top three winning teams, and best dressed. All proceeds raised will benefit the NFHS Foundation.
